

Joint statement by 333 Civil Society Organizations and Revolutionary Forces to reject Myanmar Military Junta from ASEAN Foreign Ministers Meetings

Subject: Democratic representation of Myanmar people at the upcoming ASEAN Foreign Ministers meeting and related events



Dear ASEAN leaders,



We, the undersigned 203 organisations, are writing this open letter to you to request your support for the democratic will of Myanmar people in relation to the upcoming ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting and related events that will be held from July 21 to 27 in Vientiane, Laos.

Specifically, we are seeking your commitment to:

- exclude Myanmar military junta members from all ASEAN meetings and events;
- ensure that the people of Myanmar are represented by their democratically elected leaders, the National Unity Government, in all ASEAN meetings and events.

We are concerned that members of the military junta that is currently illegally and illegitimately occupying the institutions of national government in Myanmar and inflicting extreme violence on the people may have been invited to some of the events associated with the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting. Our concerns follow the fact that earlier this year under the Lao PDR presidency of ASEAN, the military junta's 'permanent secretary' for foreign affairs attended the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Retreat in Luang Prabang.



Recalling ASEAN's decision to exclude the military junta leader-ship from high-level meetings since October 2021, an invitation for military junta representatives to attend events related to the upcoming ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting would create a 'back-door entrance' to the high-level meetings which are to be held in the same week, in the same location, among many of the same invitees. As you would be aware, ASEAN's position was adopted in response to the junta's failure to implement ASEAN's Five-Point Consensus which called for a cessation of violence and dialogue towards a peaceful resolution to the crisis that has resulted from the junta's attempted coup. We expect that you would also be aware that since then the military junta has made no effort or progress towards a return to peace and democracy.

While ASEAN has aimed to invite 'non-political' representatives of the Myanmar military junta to meetings, it must be noted that 'non-political' representatives of the junta do not exist. Since the junta began its attempted coup, hundreds of thousands of civil servants from ministries and other entities of government in Myanmar who oppose the military junta have been participating in the nationwide Civil Disobedience Movement in which they refuse to work under the illegal and illegitimate military junta. Thus, it should be expected that anyone attending an international meeting on behalf of a government ministry that is currently occupied by the military junta has been chosen by, and is therefore a political representative of, the junta.

We would like to underline the fact that the Myanmar military junta is not, by any definition, a government and therefore has no legitimacy to represent the people of Myanmar in any ASEAN meetings or activities. As you would be aware, a democratic general election was held in Myanmar on November 8, 2020. In a landslide victory, the voters elected a government led by the incumbent National League for Democracy party. Independent national and international election observers unanimously concluded that the election was free and fair, and the result represented the will of the Myanmar people.

Yet, on February 1, 2021, the Myanmar military launched an illegal coup attempt. Since then, an illegal and illegitimate military junta has occupied multiple institutions of government, including domestic ministries, the central bank, overseas embassies and the former national chambers of commerce and industry, and attempted to pose as the government of Myanmar. The junta refers to itself as the 'State Administrative Council' (SAC), even though it has no authority to hold government office. The military junta is rejected by the people of Myanmar because it is an illegal criminal organisation that meets the criteria for a terrorist organisation under both Myanmar national law and international law.

Under the guise of the SAC, the military junta has launched a nationwide campaign of heinous crimes against the people of Myanmar in an attempt to suppress and control them. To date, the military has killed over 5,300 people, arrested over 27,000 and detained over 20,700. The military has committed massacres, indiscriminate airstrikes, artillery shelling, sexual and gender-based violence, mass torture and mass arson. Such atrocities amount to war crimes and crimes against humanity. As a result of these crimes, an estimated 3 million people have been internally displaced. The junta is led by the same generals who stand accused of genocide and crimes against humanity under universal jurisdiction in Argentina, and are under investigation by the Office of the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.

Meanwhile, the remaining elected members of the government and parliament (the 'Pyidaungsu Hluttaw' in Burmese) formed the Committee Representing Pyidaungsu Hluttaw (CRPH) and then the National Unity Government (NUG) based on the mandate gained from the 2020 election results. Thus, the appropriate, legitimate and democratically elected representatives of Myanmar people in all international fora, including ASEAN meetings, are the National Unity Government (NUG). We encourage you to establish formal diplomatic relations with the NUG, if you have not done so already. The NUG can be contacted via the details provided on their official website.

By contrast, when ASEAN and foreign governments engage with the military junta as though it were a government and enable the junta's representatives to network with the international community, this risks significant harms for the people of Myanmar, including:

- · decisions being made illegitimately on behalf of Myanmar people;
- legitimising the Myanmar military junta and assisting their illegal at tempts to appear as a government;
- assisting the military junta to build relationships and gain access to funds and resources;
- ultimately, assisting the military junta in its illegal (and to date unsuccessful) quest to take full control of the country.

Engagement with the Myanmar military junta also brings risks for ASEAN and foreign governments, such as damaging the governments' credibility in the eyes of existing and future democratic leaders of Myanmar. When engagement with the junta is facilitated by ASEAN entities, it also inflames existing tensions within Myanmar and dramatically undermines any remaining credibility of ASEAN for diplomacy and mediation.

It is clear that multiple ASEAN member states and dialogue partners are opposed to, or at least deeply concerned about, military junta representatives being involved in ASEAN meetings and events. For example,



ASEAN has excluded the junta from previous foreign ministers' meetings and summits and has decided not to allow Myanmar to assume the rotating leadership in 2026. Further, the ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting (ADMM) excluded junta representative Mya Tun Oo from participation in ministerial meetings in November 2022. The Philippines, Malaysia and Indonesia boycotted an ADMM air force chiefs meeting hosted by the military junta in September 2023. Singapore also boycotted ADMM-Plus counter-terrorism training sessions hosted by the Myanmar military junta and Russia in August 2023. All of these actions have been welcomed by the people of Myanmar.

Yet, further serious action is urgently needed from ASEAN, namely excluding the military junta from ASEAN meetings and events and ensuring that the people of Myanmar are represented by their democratically elected government. These actions would be in line with the United Nations' decision to avoid allowing military junta members to represent Myanmar in the General Assembly. This request also echoes the concerns raised by the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in Myanmar who recommends that ASEAN must not allow Myanmar military junta personnel to participate in any ASEAN meetings. He also calls on ASEAN Member States to "not attend if the invitations to the junta military personnel are not rescinded." Further, the Special Rapporteur urges that "Member States who support human rights, democracy, and the aspirations of the people of Myanmar publicly reject the SAC's false claim as a legitimate government and instead recognise the NUG as the legitimate representative of the people of Myanmar."
